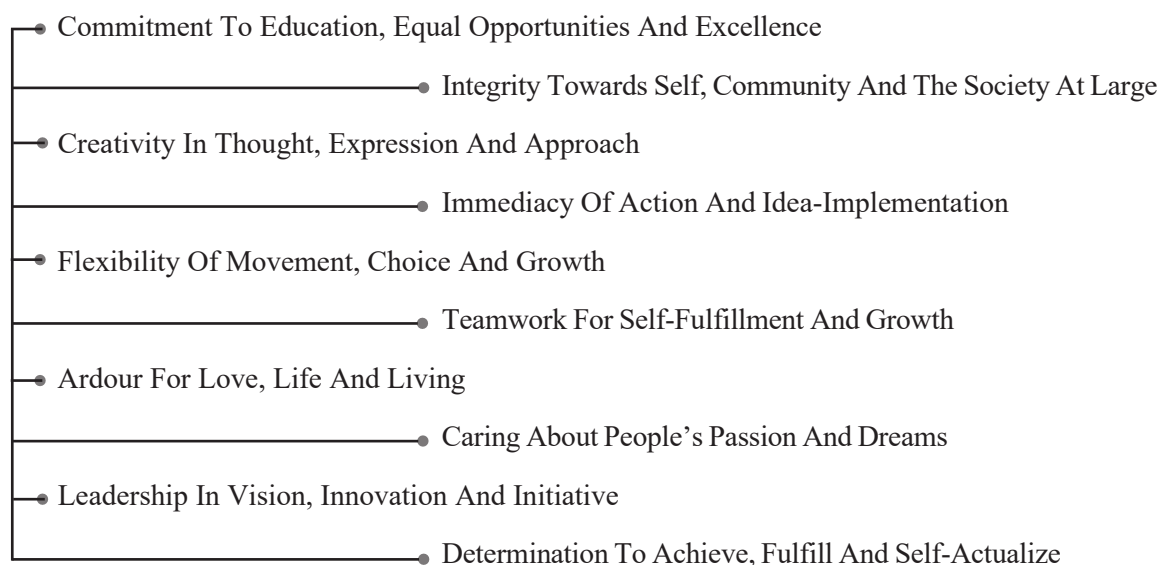

Vision

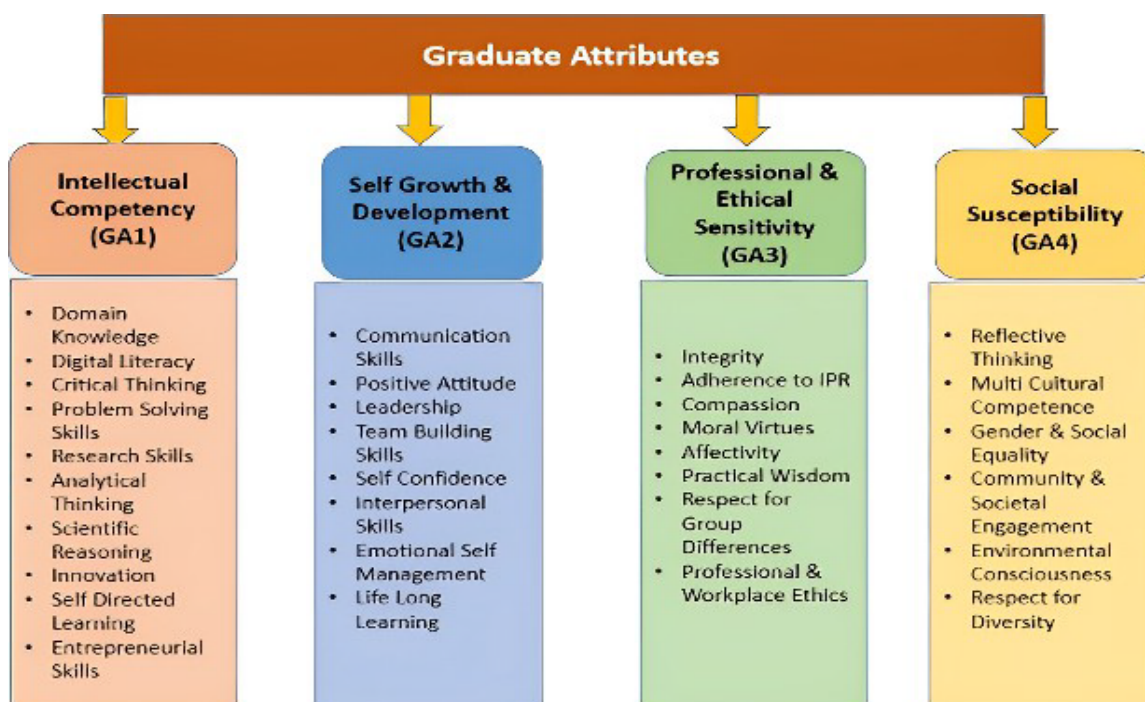

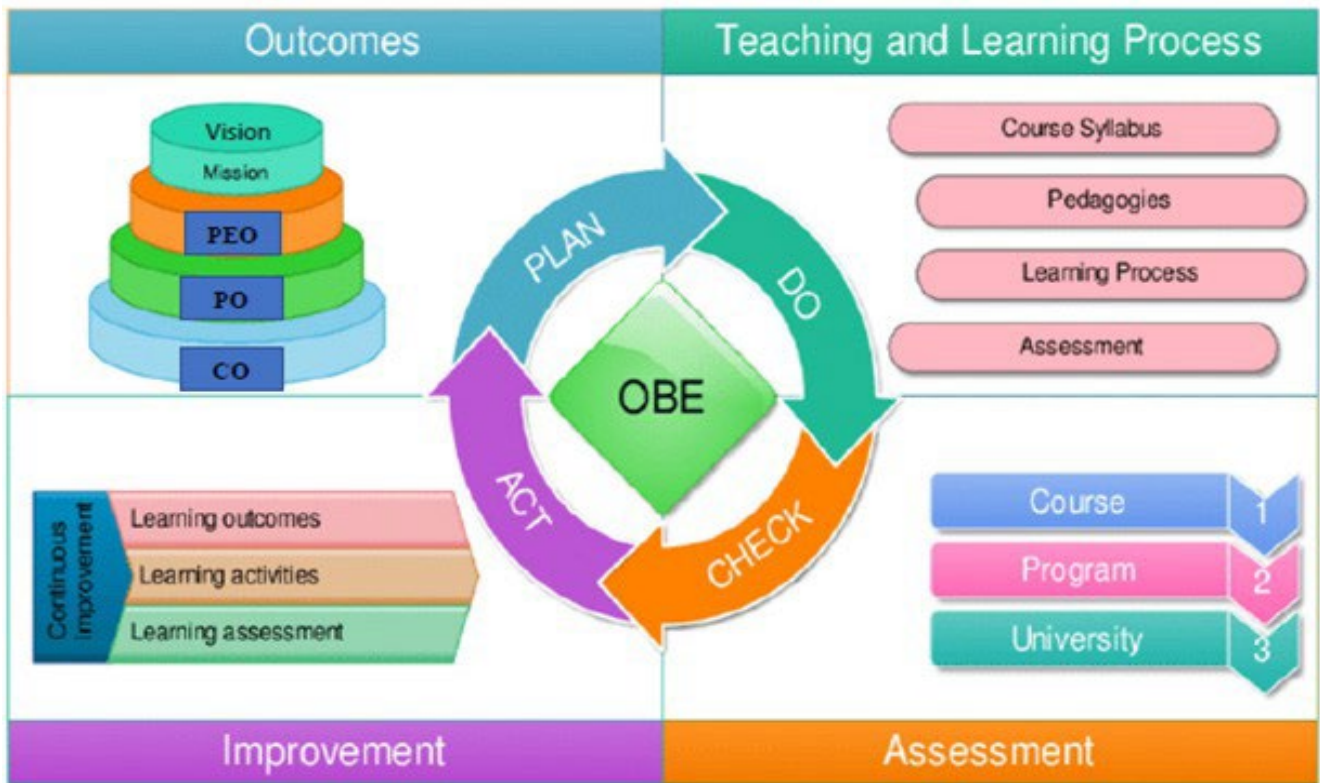
Expectations from students under OBE: Outcome

- Students should be able to: write project proposals, complete projects, analyse case studies, give case presentations, show their abilities to think, question, research, and make decisions based on the findings.
- Be more creative, able to analyse and synthesize information.
- Able to plan and organize tasks, able to work in a team as a community or in entrepreneurial service teams to propose solutions to problems and market their solutions.
- Students should be enriched on three dimensional scales of knowledge, skill and attitude throughout the course.

Blended Teaching Learning Pedagogy

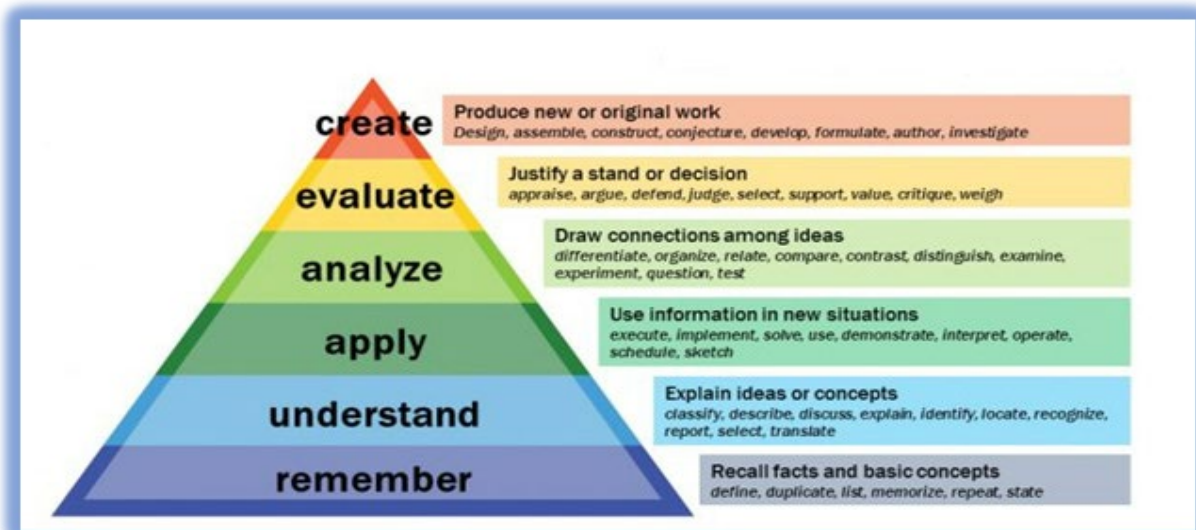
The evolution of the digital learning platforms has a huge impact in educational institutions. As a result of this, the art of combining digital learning tools with more traditional classroom face to face teaching gave birth to the term “Blended Learning”. The NEP 2020 recommends for use of blended models of learning.

JRU has adopted a dedicated online Learning Management System from the academic session 2020 onwards to provide students and faculty members with a single robust, secure and integrated system to create personalized learning environments. Each students and faculty members have their individual dashboard with individual login & password. Through the dashboard faculty members take the live class and provide students the study resources (like PPTs, Audio & Video Lectures, Handouts etc.) Syllabus, Lesson plan, Assignments, Attendance, and Continuous Assessments etc. are available in the dashboard. Beside University dedicated online Learning Management System-Moodle there are several ICT initiatives taken by the University for the implementation of Blended Learning like- fully equipped E-Class Rooms, Massive open online courses (MOOC) for students, Online Discussion, E-Journals with easy access, Resource sharing through NDL, Online Expert video lectures i.e. NPTEL & Referred resources etc.



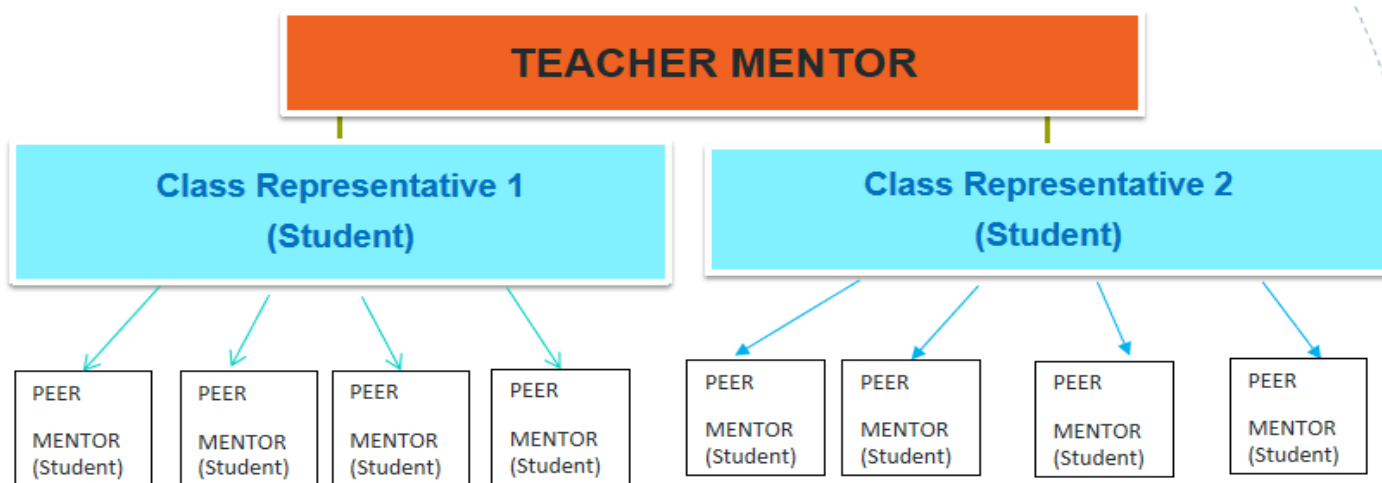
Bloom's Taxonomy:

There are six levels of cognitive learning according to the revised version of Bloom's Taxonomy. Each level is conceptually different. The six levels are remembering, understanding, applying, analyzing, evaluating, and creating.



MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Jharkhand Rai University have a 'Mentorship Program' for the betterment of the students where the teachers are assigned a particular class/ section for mentoring them. Mentor acts as a bridge between the students and the University. They monitor their academic as well as personal growth. In academic progress, the mentor looks after their attendance, discipline, assignments, examination, class notes etc. For personal growth, a mentor empathizes with the students. They assess the causes of their personal problems and try to cater their needs as and when required and wherever possible. The concerned teacher mentor gives students a platform to take some responsibility of themselves and their classmates and assign few students as a 'Class Representative' and 'Peer Mentors'.



The concerned Mentor selects two students for Class Representatives of the particular class who in turn take the responsibility of the class. They act as a bridge between the students and the mentor. They are responsible for any academic and nonacademic activities of all the students of their respective classes. Besides this they are not only responsible for maintaining discipline inside the class but they are also responsible for informing students about various notices, class timings etc. They meet the mentor on daily basis, discuss about any issues related to the class and immediately get a solution for the same. The mentors keep a regular check of the class activity on daily basis through the Class Representatives.

Peer Mentors take charge of a group of students and are responsible for helping other students of the class in studies, notes and other academic problems. Students who have a sound academic background are elected as peer mentors. This inculcates leadership and team building in the students.

Teacher Mentors deals with the problems and gives the solution related to social, psychological, emotional and academic issues of the students wherever possible. The students always feel free to discuss their concern with their mentor. The teacher mentor always encourages the students to express their grievances / problems freely and frankly, without any fear.

Life Skills (Jeevan Kaushal)

Life skills has been considered as the pillars of human development both in personal and professional life. It is “The abilities for adaptive and positive behaviour that enable individuals to deal effectively with the demands and challenges of everyday life”. It can be said as “A behaviour change or behaviour development approach designed to address a balance of three areas: Knowledge, Attitudes, and Skills”. The new National Education Policy (NEP 2020) aims to see India a “Global Knowledge Superpower” and “Skill Hub”. With this objective Jeevan Kaushal Scheme is proposed by UGC- University Grants Commission. It has endorsed and recognised Life Skills (Jeevan Kaushal) as pillars of holistic development to be learnt and practiced throughout lives. It is being believed that education in Bharat is filled up with the feelings of ‘Om Asto Ma Sadgamaya, Tamaso Ma Jyotirgamaya, Mrityormamaritam Gamaya’. It is the concept of Panchkosha focussing on the holistic development comprising of body, life, mind, intellect and spiritual development of an individual. The aim of the life is not only just to survive, but to thrive. Keeping this in mind we at Jharkhand Rai University work towards the objective of equipping our students with overall development of their personality. We focus on developing their basic skills, knowledge, right attitude, intellect, as well as their spiritual development so that they are able to live a balanced and successful life.

Jharkhand Rai University has incorporated ‘Life Skills’ development program as an integral part of its regular courses. It is compulsory for all the students and has due weightage across all the courses. The curriculum is designed in a way that it proves to be instrumental for the holistic development of students for effective/ ethical learning and better/benevolent learning. It includes and promotes development and inculcation of human values, self-awareness, self-recognition, ethics, morality, discipline, empathy, benevolence, reverence, decisiveness, communication, time management, resilience, emotional betterment, mental health, psychological health, problem solving, conflict reduction, stress management, responsible and ethical use of digital technology and internet, valuing peer learning and team work, planning, improved relationships, character building and above all it also improves the social interactions and promote the symbiotic nature for the holistic development of personality of students.

The aim is to groom the students and enhance these abilities so that they can survive in the competitive world and successfully navigate the complexities of life. Now a days, organizations give priority to those professionals who are not only proficient in their fields but are also adept in soft skills especially Communication and Interpersonal skills. In order to enhance these skills we provide the students with regular spoken English classes apart from teaching them the modules of Life Skills. For this purpose we have a very dedicated team of experts who mentor and guide the students efficiently.



Through this module we aim to bring positive changes in the students' personality and behaviour and have designed this module to:

- Enable students to build a good rapport, interact and work effectively with others (Team Building and Leadership Skills)
- Develop effective communication Skills and interpersonal skills in order to successfully put their viewpoints across.
- Prepare students to play constructive roles for family, society, nation and the world.
- To transform students into ideal personalities by inculcating Sanskaaras.
- Prepare students to analyse social and cultural influences on attitudes, values and behaviour, question injustice, explore and evaluate social roles, rights and responsibilities.
- Develop problem solving and decision-making skills.
- Prepare the students for their character building and integrated development of their personality.

Character Building and Holistic Development of Personality

Jharkhand Rai University (JRU) offers a dedicated course on Character Building & Holistic Development of Personality aimed at nurturing students into responsible, ethical, confident, and socially conscious individuals. The course adopts a holistic approach to student development by integrating values, ethics, emotional intelligence, self-awareness, communication skills, leadership, discipline, empathy, social responsibility, and life skills into the learning process. It encourages students to develop a positive attitude, integrity, resilience, critical thinking, and a sense of purpose while preparing them to respond effectively to personal, professional, and societal challenges. Through interactive sessions, reflective activities, experiential learning, discussions, and community engagement, the course seeks to strengthen the overall personality of students and enable them to become competent professionals, responsible citizens, and compassionate human beings.

SWAYAM MOOCs

Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) have emerged as a viable model for imparting education, involving conventional and online education. The Indian version of online learning is being launched on an indigenous platform of learning, named as SWAYAM (Study Web of Active Learning by Young and Aspiring Minds). There is a need to create synergies between the salient features of anytime-anywhere format of E-Learning and the traditional classroom-based chalk and talk method to develop a unique content delivery mechanism, which is responsive to learners' needs and ensures seamless transfer of knowledge across geographical boundaries. There is also a need to put in place a mechanism that would allow seamless connect between the online learning and the regular class room learning. Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) are such online courses which are developed as per the pedagogy stated herein; following the four-quadrant approach and made available on the SWAYAM platform of Government of India. Students are required to opt for **one course carrying a minimum of 3 or 4 credits** as a mandatory requirement for the award of the degree.

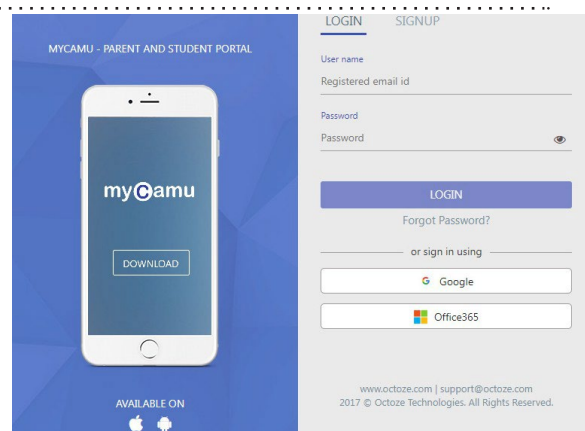

NAD - Digi Locker (Digital Document Wallet)

Jharkhand Rai University has joined the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) initiative to facilitate the academic mobility of students with the freedom to study across the Higher Education Institutions in the country, under multiple entry and exit scheme. Students of different programs of the University have registered on the ABC portal and created their ABC id. The ABC platform is a virtual repository or credit database, where the students will have their own accounts, each with their own ABC ID



As per exact statistics, the University has digitized the records of all pass out students on Digi Locker who have been awarded degree/certificate by the University in the convocation ceremonies. These students and their prospective employers can access their records anytime and from anywhere.

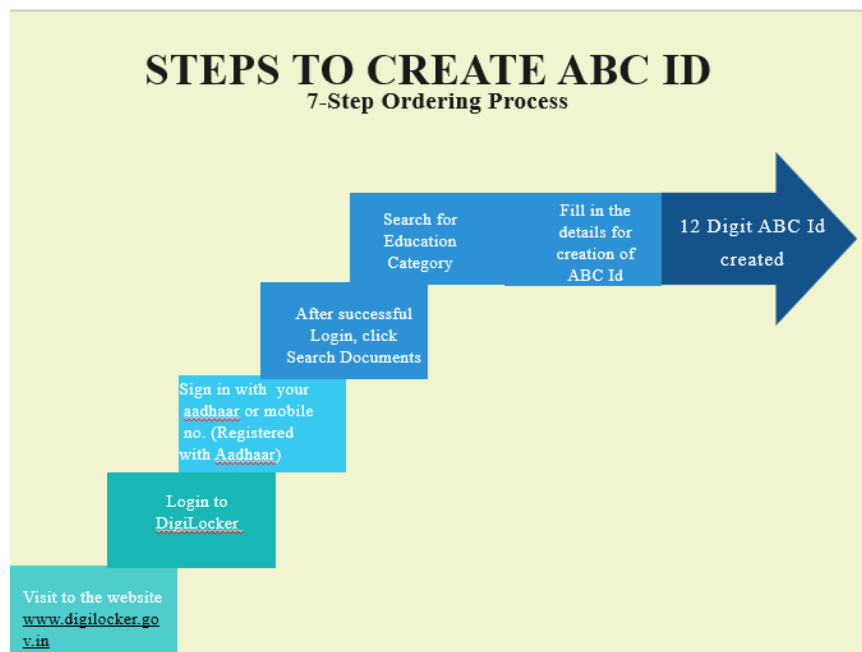
ABC is a bank for academic purposes on the pattern of commercial banks for financial purposes with students as academic account holders to whom ABC shall provide a variety of services including credit verification, credit accumulation, credit transfer or redemption and authentication of academic awards. It allows student to choose own learning path. Through ABC platform, “Credits awarded to a student for one program from an institution may be transferred / redeemed by another institution upon students consent”.

Steps to create ABC id:

- Visit to the website www.digilocker.gov.in and Login to DigiLocker (Student with DigiLocker Account can create ABC ID).
- Sign in to your DigiLocker account.
- While signing in, enter your aadhaar or mobile no. (Registered with Aadhaar) Then enter the six-digit security pin. (Click “Forgot Security Pin” in case of lost Security Pin and follow the steps to update the security pin).
- DigiLocker will send an OTP to your registered mobile no. and email. Enter the OTP and click **Submit** button.
- Once the login is successful, click **Search Documents** in the left pane of your DigiLocker dashboard view. Search for Education. The Education category shows **Academic Bank of Credits** service. Click the service button. Click the **ABC ID Card**. Input your name, DoB and Gender in the ABC id Card page. Click the check box below to provide your consent and click **Get Document** button. DigiLocker issues the **Issued Documents**. In this list, your 12-digit ABC ID is displayed in the **ABC ID Card** section. Click inside the section and you will see a page on the screen that displays your ABC ID.

Note:

1. ABC ID can also be created through the website abc.gov.in.
2. Students belonging to eligible Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) can avail the facility of ABC.

- The library is a study area in which reasonable quiet is essential.
- The library shall remain open on all working days from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm
- Library permission before you enter or leave the library.
- Property counter is maintained for keeping all of your belongings.
- All the documents should be properly handled. Do not write anything on the books.

- Books should be placed in their proper place after using it.
- Library membership is open to all students and faculty members of the University. Students and staff members however can apply for the membership on prescribed application form.
- One Library membership card from “Circulation Section” shall be issued for borrowing books in the library.
- Two Books from the “Circulation Section” shall be issued for a maximum period of fifteen days at a time. The books may be issued for the faculty members for three months.
- The books may be renewed if the same are not in demand or are not reserved by other readers.
- Reference books are only used within the library premises, not to be issued.
- Book(s) once issued will not be returned on the same day.
- Borrowers shall return the books on or before the due date, failing which an overdue fine of “Five” rupees per day per book will be levied. Producing “Medical Certificate” will not entitle a student to get exemption from the fine. No book will be issued to the student unless he / she returns back the overdue book(s).
- Books marked Reference book, not to be issued, magazines, newspapers, project reports, audio / video cassettes shall not be issued to the students.
- The Librarian reserves the right to recall any book issued even prior to the due date, if required.
- Students are required to obtain a “No Dues Certificate” at the end of each semester. Defaulters will not be allowed to appear in the examinations.
- Borrowers shall be responsible for safe return of the books to the library. While borrowing a book student must ensure that book is in good condition. Any damage must be brought to the notice of library staff. The student will have to either replace the book or will pay double the market price of the book, if any damage or disfigurement of the book is noticed at the time of returning the book in the library. If any book so damaged or lost belongs to a set of books, the borrower shall have to replace the whole set or pay double the price of the set.
- Library is a place for making best use of the learning resources. Complete silence shall be maintained in the library. Members are, therefore, advised not to indulge in conversation, consultation, discussion or demonstrative greetings of friends. Any defaulter may be suspended from the library for a period up to 15 days.
- “Mobile Phones” shall be kept switched off or in the vibration mode before you enter the library.
- Bags, folders, personal books, magazines, ladies purse, etc are not allowed to be brought inside the library.
- Separate Property counter is maintained for this purpose. Students in their own interest are advised not to leave money in their bags, purses, etc.
- Visitors are not entertained inside the library without prior permission of the Librarian.
- Stealing or damaging books / magazines, etc. from the library or misbehaviour shall be considered as an offence for which strict disciplinary action will be taken against the student(s) concerned to the extent of expulsion from the University.

Computer Lab.

The Computer Lab at the University has more than 120 desktops. All the desktops have seamless internet access. \ We provide a network of latest computers, adequately matched and supported by a host of printers, scanners, modems and other peripheral devices. Staff Members & students using laptops and smart phones can also benefit from Wi-Fi facility available in the campus.

Rules:

- The students can access the computer labs from 9:00 am to 5:00 p.m. and also have an access to free Internet facility. However, time is designated to individual student groups for access to the computer lab.

- In case of any damage by the student to any property of the computer lab, necessary deductions shall be made from the students' security deposit.
- The student shall have to make arrangements for his own computer stationary.
- The students are allowed to take out print out of academic material on payment basis.
- No external storage media including pen drives will be allowed inside the computer lab.
- Bags, eatables, drinks are not allowed inside the computer lab.
- Students will be allowed to work as per the availability of the computers.
- Students will not be allowed to use the facilities of the lab while their regular classes are being conducted in the University.
- Any student found chatting on the internet and playing games would be debarred from the lab.
- No student will be allowed to copy software from the lab illegally and indulge in any other act that may qualify as piracy or violation of intellectual property rights of an individual are required to obtain the No-Due certificate at the end of each semester.

Hostels

We at JRU believe in providing students with a friendly ambience in our hostels so that learning and growing is fostered. Our aim is to help students not only living in harmony and peace but also balancing their time between studies and extracurricular activities.

The University provides hostel facility for both boys and girls. Presently it is capable of servicing 170 boys & 174 girls inside the campus.

The hostel rooms are equipped with 24 hours of power back up and security.

The dining space has a seating capacity for more than 150 students at a time and provides students a comfortable and hygienic environment. MECHANISM FOR PROTECTING & HONOURING, RIGHTS & DIGNITY

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

Ragging is a criminal Offence as per the Supreme Court verdict. Ragging is an offence under section 4 of the IPC 1860 (Act 45 of 1860) which defines ragging as:

“Causes including compelling or forcing a student whether by way of practical jokes or otherwise to do any act which detracts from human dignity or violates his/her personal dignity or exposes him/her to ridicule from doing any lawful act by intimidating him or by using criminal force on him/her by holding out to him/her any threat of intimidation wrongful confinement, injury or the use of criminal force.”

Ragging in all its forms is totally banned at all Universities and colleges including in its departments constituent units, all its premises (academic/ residential, sports and cafeteria whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students, whether public/ private. The Institution shall take strict action, including but not limited to criminal proceedings and/ or cancellation of admission against those found guilty of proof shall hereby lie on the perpetrator of alleged ragging and not on the victim. An offence of ragging may be charged either on written complaint by the affected or on independent finding of the anti-ragging squad. The University strictly follows the UGC regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institution. An anti-ragging squad is formed overseeing the implementation of the recommendation of the anti-ragging verdict. This squad comprises of teaching faculty, supporting staff, administrators and student representatives. The name of the members along with their contact number will be displayed on the University notice board.

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student with rudeness.
- Indulging in rowdy or any indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension there of in any fresher or any other student.
- Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assign to an individual or a group of students.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student
- Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health of person.
- Any act of abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.

Any act that affects the mental health and self- confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Punishment against Ragging

Depending upon the nature and the gravity of the offence as established by the anti-ragging committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging shall be anyone or a combination of the following:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withdrawing/ withholding scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- Forfeiting campus placement opportunities / criminal recommendation.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process. Withholding of results & fine of Rupees 10,000.
- Debarring from representing the institution in regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival and other institutional events.
- Suspension/ Expulsion from the hostel.
- Rustication from the institution for a period, ranging from 1 to 3 years.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period.
- Collective punishment: When a person committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

- In addition, in case of every single incident of ragging, a First Information Report (FIR) will be filed with the local police authorities; the possible punishment includes rigorous imprisonment (in compliance with the order of Supreme Court of India)

The fresher / junior students are hereby instructed that they should move in groups within the academic areas/campus.

Depending upon the severity of the act the penalty could be as under:

1. Warning
2. Report to Parents
3. Probation (He / She may be allowed to attend the classes under close scrutiny by the mentor. Attendance may or may not be given)
4. Fine
5. Compensation for the damage of the property
6. Suspension/Rustication from the Hostel and/or University.

Appeal: The student may appeal to the Vice Chancellor whose decision will be final and binding.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

University has a structure procedure and mechanism for redressal of the grievances of students. University endeavor to make all efforts to ensure transparency in all the activities at different levels.

University has a Grievance Redressal Committees at the Department/University level to deal with the grievances of the students:

- a. Department/Area Level committee will be as under:
 - i. Head of the Department - Chairman
 - ii. Up to 3 (three) faculties to be nominated by the Head of Department
 - iii. Student Mentor

This committee will deal with the Grievance related to Academic and Administrative matters of the Department/Area concerned.

- b. University Level committee will be as under:
 - i. A senior Teacher / Professor – Chairman
 - ii. Dean Student Welfare- Member Secretary
 - iii. Dean of the Faculty concerned
 - iv. Head of Department concerned
 - v. Student Mentor Concerned

This committee will deal with all the Grievances directly which is related to the common problems at University level both Academic and Administrative. In addition, this committee will also entertain the appeal filed by student against the decision of the Department level committee.

Procedure for Redressal of Grievances (RoG)

- c. An aggrieved student who has the Grievance or Grievances at the Department shall make an application first to the HoD. The Head of Department, after verifying the facts will try to redress the grievance within a reasonable time, preferably within a week of the receipt of application of the student. If the student is not satisfied with the verdict or solution of the HoD, then the same should be placed before the Department level committee.
- d. If the student is not satisfied with the redressal offered by the Department level committee and feel that his/ her Grievance is not redressed, he/she can submit an appeal to the University level committee within a week from the date of receipt of decision with the relevant details.
- e. The University level committee should consider the appeal of the student and make appropriate recommendations to the Vice- Chancellor within a reasonable time, preferably within 15 days. On approval by the Vice- Chancellor, the final decision is to be communicated to the student through the respective Head of Institute.
- f. The University level committee, if needed, may recommend to the Vice-Chancellor, necessary corrective action as it may deem fit, to endure avoidance of recurrence of similar grievance at any Department under the University.
- g. While dealing with the complaint the committee at all levels will observe law of natural justice and hear the complainant and concerned people.
- h. While passing an order on any Grievance at any level the relevant provisions of Act/Regulations should be kept in mind and no such order should be passed in contradiction of the same.
- i. The student will submit the application of Grievance or appeal to the University level committee, as the case may be, through the Head of Department concerned.

Classification of NSS Programme:

NSS activities have been divided in two major groups. These are regular NSS activities and special camping programme

- (a) Regular NSS Activity: Under this, students undertake various programmes in the adopted villages, college/school campuses and urban slums during weekends or after college hours;
- (b) Special Camping Programme: Under this, camps of 10 days duration are organised in the adopted villages or urban slums during vacations with some specific projects by involving the local communities. 50% NSS volunteers are expected to participate in these camps.
- (c) Republic Day Parade Camp: Every year volunteers are selected for Annual Republic Day Parade Camp to be held at New Delhi.

POLICY FOR MENTAL HEALTH & WELL-BEING

1. Preamble

Jharkhand Rai University, Ranchi recognizes that mental health and well-being are essential for academic excellence and holistic development. In accordance with the UGC Guidelines on Uniform Policy on Mental Health & Well-being for Higher Educational Institutions (2026) and the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, the University adopts this Mental Health and Well-being Policy to promote a safe, inclusive, and supportive campus environment for students, faculty, and staff. The policy aligns with the NEP 2020, UMMEED Guidelines, Manodarpan Initiative, National Suicide Prevention Strategy, and UN Sustainable Development Goal 3 (Good Health and Well-being).

2. Objectives

- **Holistic Support Ecosystem:** To establish a comprehensive framework for mental health promotion, prevention, early identification, counselling, referral, and clinical intervention.

- **Mental Health Awareness:** To promote mental health literacy through regular awareness, sensitization, and educational programs for students, faculty, staff, and parents.
- **Early Identification and Support:** To ensure timely identification of individuals requiring psychological support and facilitate appropriate intervention and referral services.
- **Peer and Mentor Engagement:** To strengthen faculty mentoring and peer-support systems that encourage empathy, inclusion, and early assistance.
- **Accessible and Confidential Services:** To provide professional, accessible, confidential, and non-discriminatory mental health support services for the University community.
- **Safe and Inclusive Campus:** To foster a healthy, inclusive, and stigma-free campus environment that promotes emotional well-being and mutual respect.
- **Crisis Intervention and Suicide Prevention:** To establish effective mechanisms for crisis response, suicide prevention, and post-crisis support in accordance with national guidelines.
- **Capacity Building:** To enhance the competencies of faculty, mentors, wardens, counsellors, and staff through regular training and skill development programs.
- **Institutional Accountability:** To ensure effective governance through monitoring, policy review, compliance audits, and submission of annual reports as prescribed by the UGC.
- **Collaboration and Continuous Improvement:** To strengthen partnerships with government agencies, mental health institutions, and community organizations while promoting research, innovation, and continuous improvement in mental health services.

3. Institutional Framework.

Jharkhand Rai University establish a dual-layered structure to ensure administrative accountability and professional implementation:

A. Mental Health & Well-being Monitoring Committee

Headed directly by the **Head of the Institute**, this committee supervises policy compliance, reviews code of ethics adherence, ensures infrastructural safety, and evaluates annual performance indicators. It includes representatives from faculty, non-teaching staff, students, hostel wardens, and family/alumni groups. A designated Nodal Officer will act as the direct liaison with the UGC.

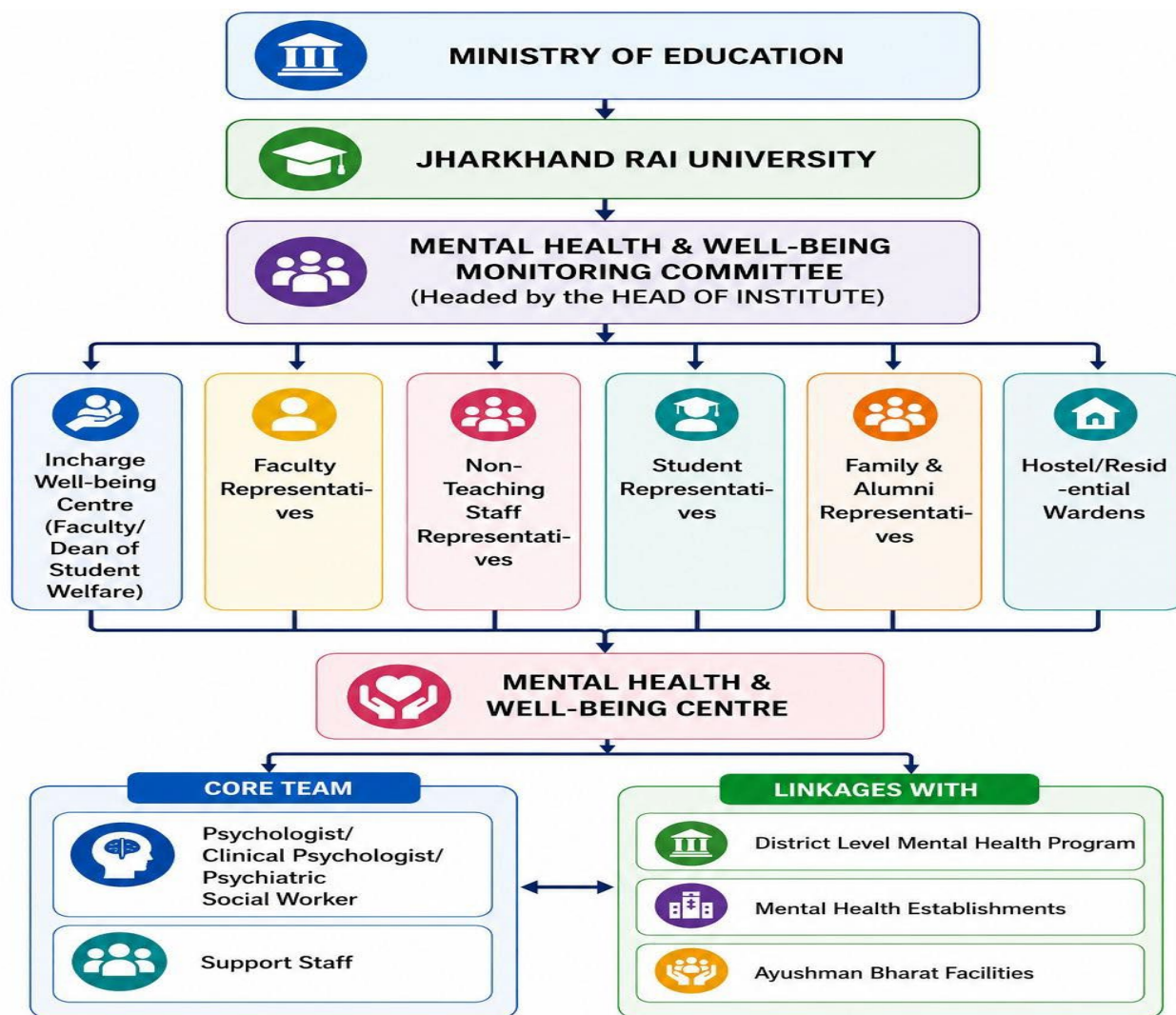


Fig 1: Overview of the organizational structure of the Mental Health & Well-being Centre

4. Services and Programmes

A. Counselling and Psychological Services

- Individual counselling, group counselling, psychoeducation, and referral services for students and staff.
- Special focus on:
 - Academic stress, exam anxiety, adjustment issues.
 - Neurodevelopmental and neurodivergent profiles (Neurodevelopmental describes a condition that starts during early childhood as the brain and nervous system grow and develop & Neurodivergent describes having a brain that processes information, learns, or behaves differently than what society considers “typical”)
 - Trauma, grief, relationship issues, substance use, and self-harm concerns.

B. Awareness, Sensitization and Life Skills

University Grant Commission and National Education Policy emphasis awareness programs and life skills training.

- Regular workshops on:
 - Stress management, mindfulness, self-care, study skills.
 - Digital well-being and responsible use of social media.
 - Inclusion, gender sensitivity, disability and neurodiversity.
- Observance of:
 - World Mental Health Day and other national campaigns.
 - Manodarpan-inspired activities on emotional well-being and resilience.

C. Integration with Curriculum and Co-curricular Activities

- Infusing well-being topics into foundation and orientation program i.e., ROOTS – The Foundation Program “Deeksharambh”.
- Collaboration with clubs, NSS/Community outreach cells to promote peer support and community-based mental health initiatives.

5. Crisis Management and Suicide Prevention

University Grant Commission guidelines explicitly require crisis management infrastructure.

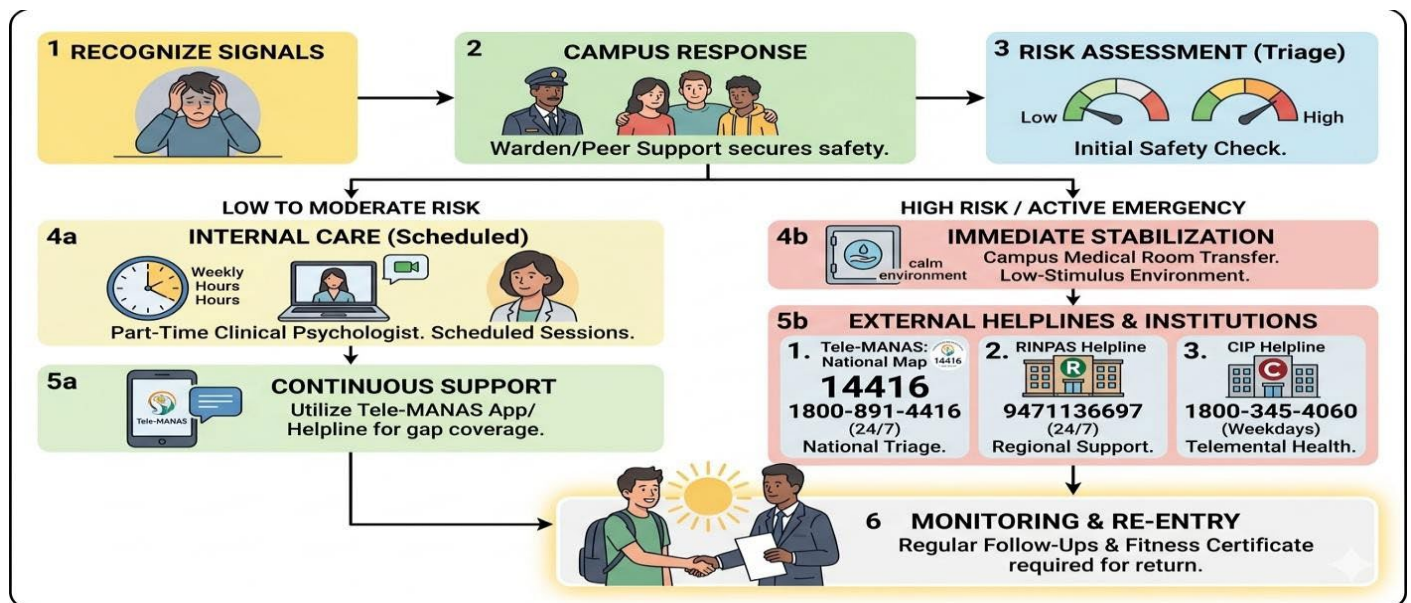


Fig 2: Pictorial overview of crisis response protocol

- Jharkhand Rai University will adopt a **Crisis Response Protocol** including:
 - Training for faculty, staff, and peer leaders to recognize warning signs: abrupt changes in attendance, behaviour, communication, social withdrawal, talk of hopelessness or self-harm.
 - Clear pathways for immediate referral to Mental Health & Well-Being Centre and emergency services.
 - Post-crisis reintegration plans (academic flexibility, counselling, peer support).
- Suicide prevention infrastructure:
 - Visible display of helpline numbers, Mental Health & Well-Being Centre contact details, and national/state-level mental health helplines across campus and on the website.
- **Mandatory Displays:** The national **Manodarpan Helpline (8445440632)** and **TELE-MANAS (14416 or 1800-891-4416)** must be permanently displayed on the university website, student portals, course syllabi, hostel notice boards, and dining halls.

8. Implementation, Review and Accountability

- The Monitoring Committee will ensure with annual review.
- The policy will be **reviewed at least once every two years**, or earlier if University Grant Commission or Ministry of Education issues new guidelines.
- Feedback mechanisms:
 - Anonymous feedback forms.
 - Student–faculty consultations and meetings on well-being.

In implementation, Jharkhand Rai University will prioritise interventions for (a) exam stress and academic pressure, (b) first-generation learners from rural backgrounds, and (c) hostel residents, while ensuring that mental health services are accessible to all students and staff.

RULES & REGULATION

ACADEMIC - Submission of Documents

The newly admitted students to the UG/PG Degree & Diploma Courses of the University have to submit the following documents:

One (1) set of self-attested photocopies of the following documents:

1. Xth (Certificate and Mark Sheet)
2. XIIth (Certificate and Mark Sheet)
3. Graduation Mark Sheets (Year I, II and III) (for PG Students)
4. Consolidated Mark Sheet
5. Graduation Degree / Provisional Certificate for PG Students
6. Migration Certificate (Original)
7. Character Certificate (Original)
8. Transfer Certificate
9. Five colour passport size photographs (in formal wear)
10. UID Copy (Xerox)

Specialization / Selection of Branches

The students admitted shall fill up the specialization form or select the branches on or before last date. The department reserves the right to cancel an offered elective or to introduce new electives at any time as notified by the university.

Academic Semester

- The classes will start on the date specified in the academic calendar.
- New students will undergo an orientation course. A timetable of the course/syllabus shall be displayed on the notice board.
- The students shall submit all their assignments and projects within the dates specified in the academic calendar.
- 75% attendance is compulsory.
- Attendance in guest lectures is compulsory.
- All important notices will be displayed on the University notice board.
- Important information and syllabus can also be accessed from the university website (www.jru.edu.in)
- All the students are advised to check the notice board and visit the university website regularly.

PAYMENT OF FEES

The University fees are payable by the students for the full semester at the time of seeking admission and subsequently at the beginning of each semester. Fees once paid shall not be refunded in full or in part.

The refundable security deposit is to be claimed within three years of leaving the University, failing which the same shall stand credited to the Welfare fund.

The University fees shall be paid on the due date as specified in the admission letter failing which a late fee fine of Rupees 100 per day will be charged.

RE-REGISTRATION TO THE PROGRAM

A student who fails to appear in the End Semester Examination without prior approval from the respective HoD/Coordinator shall be required to pay a re-registration fee of ₹5,000. However, in cases where prior approval has been duly obtained, no additional re-registration fee shall be applicable. The decision of the Dean of the concerned Faculty/Dean (Academics) shall be final in such cases.

RE-REGISTRATION TO THE COURSE

A student shall be eligible to attend classes for a course in which they have a backlog, subject to the following terms and conditions:

a) In case of attending all the classes in a semester

A student would be required to pay an amount of Rs. 1500 per course in case they wish to attend all the classes (As per the credit hour requirement) in a semester. Students are also required to complete all the required Assignment/ Assessments associated with the respective course. This is also applicable for the students who have failed to submit their Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA). 75% Attendance will be mandatory to appear in the end semester exam.

b) In case of attending the Weighted Class in a Semester

A student would be required to pay an amount of Rs.1500 per course in case they wish to attend Weighted Class (i.e., 4-6 classes per semester) in a semester. Students are also required to complete all the required Assignment/ Assessments associated with the respective course. 100% Attendance in the weighted class will be mandatory to appear in the end semester exam.

ACCOUNTS

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The University fees and the related subscriptions are payable by the students for the full semester at the time of seeking admission and subsequently at the beginning of each semester. Fees and subscription once paid shall not be refunded in full or in part.

The refundable security deposit is to be claimed within three years of leaving the University, failing which the same shall stand credited to the Welfare fund.

For refund policy refer to the University website www.jru.edu.in

- The University fees shall be paid within the due date as specified in the admission letter failing which a late fee fine of Rs 100 per day will be charged for the next 10 days, failing which the name of the student will be struck off for the University rolls and he/ she shall be barred from attending classes with immediate effect.
- No separate intimation with regards to the payment of fee and striking off the rolls shall be sent. Students may however seek re-admission by paying an amount of Rs. 10,000/.
- Re-admission to the University will require the written permission of the Dean Academics, subject to the approval and payment of the re-admission fee as prescribed.
- Date of payment of fee will be as specified in the admission letter and beyond that the fine will be charged as mentioned above

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GUIDELINES FOR TRAINING AND PLACEMENT

Career Management Cell (CMC) aims to provide placement assistance for all final year students. These guidelines are framed to ensure equality and fairness of opportunity to all the students. All students who opt for placement assistance through the CMC shall abide by the guidelines prescribed herein below.

Any breach of rules specified below by any student, shall be taken up seriously by the CMC who in turn will view the matter and take action against the erring student, as it may deem fit. The University reserves the right of modifying any or all of the below norms and/or stipulating additional norms for placement which, in its judgment and discretion, are likely to benefit the students, immediately or in the future.

- A. Students must appear for each and every activity organized through Career Management Cell of Jharkhand Rai University, which will include the following:
 - a. PD Training/ Preparatory classes.
 - b. Seminars/ workshops/guest lecturers.
 - c. Industrial Visits.
 - d. Assessment tests (online / off line) / Pre-placement Talk.
 - e. Placement drives (on / off campus).
 - f. Mock Interviews
 - g. Any other activity arranged by the Career Management Cell.
- B. Students must regularly update in writing, the Career Management Cell on all information with respect to updating of
 - a. CV, % of marks obtained, results, etc.
 - b. Contact details (phone number and email address).
 - c. Any additional course / other information.
- C. Students must ensure to maintain both, 100 % attendance in all activities (point A) conducted by the Career Management Cell and more than 75 % regular class attendance including Life skills classes, failing which he/she may be debarred from any further T&P assistance process.
- D. Students may get debarred from the placement assistance process, in case any one of the following:
 - a. After getting placed with any organization through the Career Management Cell (On / off campus).
 - b. Availed maximum number of placement opportunities decided by the Career Management Cell during the placement window (final year of the course).
 - c. Violation of any one of points A. & C., above.
 - d. Not nominating oneself to a placement opportunity, where one is eligible to apply.
 - e. Not reporting in the placement venue (on / off campus) on the date and time of selection.
 - f. Any other disciplinary action imposed on the individual for any reason by the University.
 - g. Leaving any of the organization without prior information (with a valid reason) to the department.

Acts of ragging will be considered as gross indiscipline and will be severely dealt with.
3. The following acts of omission and/or commission shall constitute gross violation of the code of conduct and are liable to invoke disciplinary measures
 - Ragging.
 - Lack of courtesy and decorum; indecent behavior anywhere within or outside the campus or in University online platform.
 - Willful damage or stealthy removal of any property/belongings of the University or of fellow students.
 - Possession, consumption or distribution of alcoholic drinks or any kind of hallucinogenic drug.
 - No firearms, weapon or potentially dangerous instrument shall be carried to/stored in the campus or carried in person by any student. Those found will be expelled.
 - Adoption of unfair means in the examinations.
 - Mutilation or unauthorized possession of library books.
 - Noisy and unseemly behavior, disturbing studies of fellow-students.
 - Using anonymous identity or indecent profile photo on University online platform.

Commensurate with the gravity of the offence, the punishment may be reprimand, fine, debarment from an examination, suspension for a specified period or even outright expulsion from the Centre/University.

4. For an offence committed in:
 - (a) the University campus,
 - (b) in a classroom/ Library/ Lab, and
 - (c) elsewhere

The Head of the Department shall have the authority to reprimand or impose fine or take any other suitable

measure.

5. All cases involving punishment other than reprimand shall be reported to the Disciplinary Committee. Recommendations of the committee, which include the suggested quantum of punishment in cases of proven guilt, will be considered as final.

6. Cases of adoption of unfair means in an examination shall be dealt with by the Controller of Examinations. The Head of the Department shall recommend appropriate measures in each case to the Vice Chancellor who shall award the punishment and later report the matter to the Board of Management.

7. (i) The Head of the Department with due consultation of Dean (Academic) may debar a student from appearing in an examination on any of the following grounds, if the student's

(a) Attendance in the lecture/tutorial/practical/workshop/field visit/ project and seminar classes during the semester has been unsatisfactory;

(b) Performance in the laboratory/workshop/design etc. and work done during the Semester /project has not been satisfactory;

(c) Conduct in the classes or in the University has been unsatisfactory or the student has attempted to adopt unfair means at the examination;

(ii) A student may also be debarred from appearing at an examination if there is a written report from the University Official to the effect that the student:

(a) has not cleared the outstanding dues;

(b) has been involved in an act of misconduct or indiscipline;

(c) has been involved in any such activity, which is/amounts to detrimental towards reputation and interests of the University.
