Lex Juris National Moot Court Competition, 2026



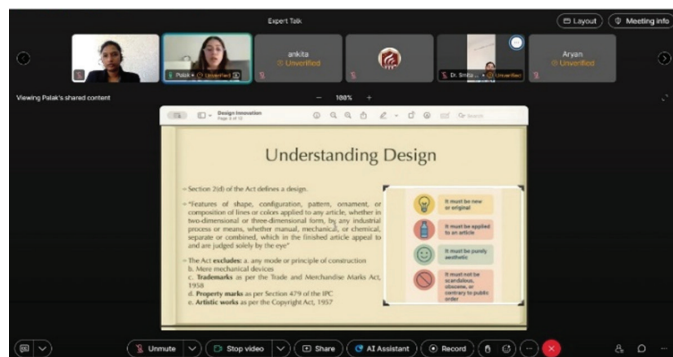

From 20th to 25th April 2026, the Department of Legal Studies organized the Lex Juris National Moot Court Competition 2026 in collaboration with the YuvaCracy Centre for Legal Affairs. The flagship event brought together 20 teams from leading law institutions across India, providing a platform for aspiring legal professionals to demonstrate their advocacy, legal research, memorial drafting, and courtroom presentation skills. The competition was convened by Ms. Vanshika Tainwala, Faculty Associate, with Ms. Aditi Apoorva, Faculty Associate, serving as the Co-Convener.

The competition featured a series of intellectually rigorous rounds that tested participants' analytical thinking, legal reasoning, and oral advocacy before experienced judges and legal professionals including Dr. Pankaj Kumar Garg, Associate Professor, Baba Farid Law College, Faridkot; Ms. Geetanjali Nigam, Assistant Professor of Law, Rabindranath Tagore University, Bhopal; Adv. Shagun Bhadana, Delhi High Court and Adv. Shailley Khatri, Indore High Court. After several closely contested rounds, Smt. V. D. Siddhartha Law College, Vijayawada, emerged as the Winner, while the National University of Study and Research in Law, Ranchi, secured the Runner-up position. The awards for Best Speaker and Best Memorial were won by Siksha 'O' Anusandhan, Odisha.

Thinking and Critical Reasoning

On 6th February 2026, the Department organized a one-day expert talk delivered by Ms. Palak Rajpal, Legal Advisor and Editor, Fashion Law Journal .

The programme was convened by Ms. Aditi Apoorva, Faculty Associate and 67 participants of the department. The expert shared her experience on the significance of integrating design thinking with critical reasoning to promote innovation, analytical decision-making, and effective problem-solving in the legal profession. Through practical illustrations and interactive discussions, students were encouraged to adopt creative, user-centric, and evidence-based approaches to legal research, advocacy, and policy development.

Memorial Drafting and Advocacy Skills

On 19th February 2026, the Department organized a workshop to strengthen students' practical understanding of moot court advocacy and legal drafting. About 83 students participated in the workshop which was conducted by Adv. Akash Raj, Jharkhand High Court. The programme was convened by Ms. Jaya Vats, Faculty Associate.

The resource person explained the essential components of an effective memorial, including the drafting of statements of facts, framing of issues, development of legal arguments, and the proper citation of judicial precedents with clarity and precision. He also shared practical courtroom strategies, emphasizing persuasive oral advocacy, courtroom etiquette, legal research techniques, and common drafting errors that aspiring advocates should avoid. Drawing upon his professional experience, Adv. Raj discussed real-life court proceedings and highlighted the importance of thorough preparation, logical reasoning, and confidence in effective legal representation.

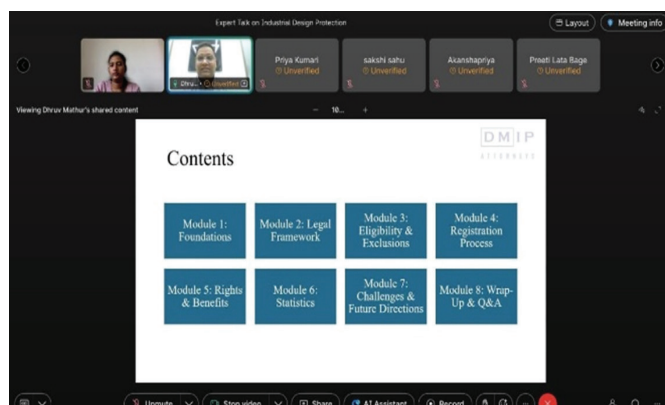

Industrial Design Protection

On 20th March 2026, the Department organized an Expert Talk which was deliberated online delivered by Mr. Dhruv Mathur, IP Attorney, an expert in Intellectual Property, Rights. The programme was convened by Ms. Aditi Apoorva, Faculty Associate and were participated 63 students of the department.

Expert Mr. Dhruv Mathur introduced students to the legal and commercial significance of industrial design protection in fostering innovation and business competitiveness. Mr. Mathur explained the concept of industrial designs, the statutory framework governing their protection, and the distinction between safeguarding aesthetic features and functional inventions. He provided a comprehensive overview of the registration process, including application requirements, documentation, examination procedures, and the exclusive rights conferred upon successful registration. Supported by practical illustrations and industry-based examples, the session also addressed issues relating to design infringement, enforcement mechanisms, and the growing importance of protecting innovative designs in today's technology-driven economy.

On 13th April 2026, the Department organized an industrial visit to the State Forensic Science Laboratory (SFSL), Hotwar, for the 45 students of BA LL.B. The visit objective was to provide practical exposure to forensic science and its indispensable role in criminal investigations and the administration of justice. During the visit, forensic experts demonstrated the scientific procedures involved in the receipt, documentation, preservation, and examination of evidence while emphasizing the importance of maintaining the chain of custody to ensure the admissibility of evidence before courts. Students visited various forensic divisions, including document examination, fingerprint analysis, narcotics testing, and biological evidence analysis departments. The experts also explained the preparation of forensic reports, the significance of expert testimony during criminal trials, and the application of forensic science in strengthening the criminal justice system.

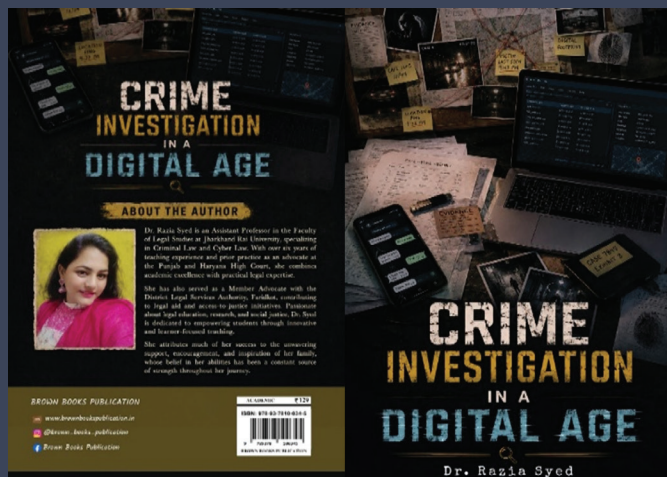
Legal and Ethical Steps in an IP-Driven Economy

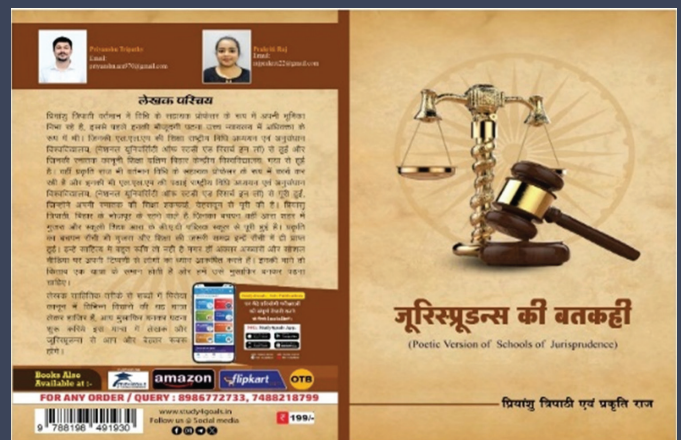
Crime Investigation in a Digital Age by Dr. Razia Syed

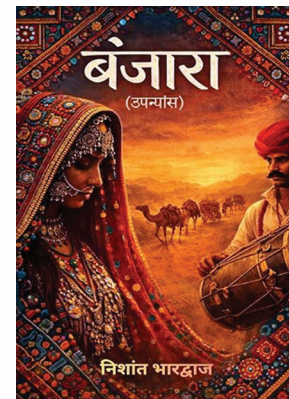
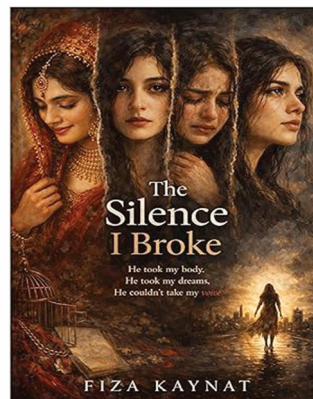
Student Secures Top 1% in NPTEL Course

About The Department

The Department of Legal Studies started in the year 2020 with the aim of producing future ready lawyers and with the aim to bridge the gap between legal theory and practice. The Department runs three programs i.e., LL. B, B.A. LLB and LL.M. Through a combination of courses in arts and law subjects, the BA LLB programme is designed to be in time with the latest Bar Council of India rules and the University Grants Commission regulations further it aims at fostering a culture of scholarship and academic excellence amongst the students.

The LLB programme familiarizes students intimately with the teaching methodologies and legal research of both national and international characters keeping in view the different types of legal systems, especially in Common Law traditions as well as Civil Law system as practiced in India. It enables students capable of analyzing and examining the economic, cultural and political impact of enacted laws. LLM degree is a one-year post-graduate degree in Law or Legal studies.
